AIA 2005	Sustainable Development	-	3	✓			This course provides a broad introduction to many issues closely related to sustainable development such as population growth, resource use, poverty alleviation, lifestyles, environment, consumerism and social inequality. The course also discusses the need to foster a sustainable environment in urban dan rural areas. Sustainability in developing nations is also examined. Development theories are discussed in an effort to help students understand issues in sustainable development.	20
2.	AIA 2009	Sociological Economy	-	3	✓			This course will examine the sociological processes and economic movements. It is rooted in the assumption that economy is part of social system. With this approach, a deeper overall understanding of the subject could be achieved, if non-economic factors and influences are also examined as well as their interaction with the economy.	20
3.	AIA 2013	Social Networks and Virtual Community	-	3	✓			This course focuses on social networks and virtual communities, and changes in human social behaviour. Using a variety of online social media, this course enable students to incorporate both the theoretical and empirical basis for making decisions and judgments about the relationship between communication and community mediator.	20

4.	AIA 2021	Adolescent Psychology	-	3	✓			A few major aspects of adolescents' life experiences will be introduced. Physical, psychological, and social development will be discussed together with individual differences according to gender, race, socio-economic status and other factors.	20
5.	AIA 2006	Marriage, Family and Kinship	-	3		✓		This course will discuss family, marriage and kinship systems. Systems of consanguinity or unilineal and ambilineal kinship will be discussed. The discussion also focuses on marriage, family structure, family function and contemporary family issues. Finally the course will discuss examples of practices in various societies having traditional systems of family and kinship, and changes that occur.	20
6	AIA 2014	Identity, Diversity and Community	-	3		✓		This course focuses on issues and problems associated with various forms of identities in the world community. Discussions cover issues related to social identity, inter-group contact and the concept of community in society. The course will also review the development of the concept of identity and community based on race, ethnic identity, gender and social class.	20
7	AIA 2022	Adolescents and Psychosocial Problems	-	3		✓		Several topics on problematic behavior of the adolescents are introduced. Among them are what is problematic behavior, why it happens and how to handle the problems.	20
